

This appliance is supplied with a moulded three pin mains plug for your safety and convenience.

A 5 amp fuse is fitted in this plug.

Should the fuse need to be replaced please ensure that the replacement fuse has a rating of 5 amp and that it is approved by ASTA or BSI to BS1362.

BS1362. Check for the ASTA mark 🐼 or the BSI mark 🕏 on the body of the fuse.

If the plug contains a removable fuse cover you must ensure that it is refitted when the fuse is replaced.

If you lose the fuse cover the plug must not be used until a replacement cover is obtained.

A replacement fuse cover can be purchased from your local Panasonic Dealer.


The wire which is coloured **green-and-yellow** must be connected to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter **E** or by the earth symbol  $\stackrel{\perp}{=}$  or coloured **green** or **green-and-yellow**.

The wire which is coloured **blue** must be connected to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter **N** or coloured **black**.

The wire which is coloured **brown** must be connected to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter **L** or coloured **red**.

#### How to replace the fuse

Open the fuse compartment with a screwdriver and replace the fuse and fuse cover.

## Preface

Matrix Switcher WJ-SX650 Series (or SX650 Series) are designed for a surveillance control system. WJ-SX650 Series (or SX650 Series) is the general term of following models.

Matrix Switcher WJ-SX650 (Video Input Board WJ-PB65C32 x 1 and Video Output Board WJ-PB65M16 x 1 have been installed.) Card Cage WJ-SX650U (For additional installation of video input boards and video output boards) Video Input Board WJ-PB65C32 Video Output Board WJ-PB65M16 Expansion Cable Kit WJ-CA65L20K/WJ-CA65L07K D-sub/BNC Video Cable WJ-CA68

### **Features**

#### • Up to 256 cameras, 32 monitors connectable

#### Remote control of optional external devices

If you connect System Controller WV-CU950, WV-CU650, WV-CU360C and/or WV-CU360CJ to this product, remote control of cameras, lenses, pan/tilt heads, and recorders (Digital Disk Recorder\*) will be available.

\* Refer to "Readme.txt" on the supplied CD-ROM for details on model numbers.

If you connect a personal computer (PC) to this product, control and system setup with WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console will be available.

## • Authentication by user ID's, passwords, and level settings.

User ID's and passwords are assignable to users to prevent inappropriate operations. In addition, the settings of level, camera access, and recorder access can determine available functions, cameras, and recorders for each user.

- Images of two or more cameras can be displayed on one monitor.
  - **Spot mode:** A selected camera image is continuously displayed on a selected monitor.
  - Sequence mode: Images of two or more cameras are sequentially displayed on a desired monitor (or monitors).

• Timer event and camera event can be scheduled.

• Alarm operation and alarm event can be scheduled.



### ■ WJ-SX650 Matrix Switcher/WJ-SX650U Card Cage

### Front View



This is the illustration of WJ-SX650.

### 1) Operation Indicator (OPERATE)

- This indicator is lighting while power is supplied to the unit.
- This indicator blinks when the cooling fan has a trouble. (Refer to p. 90.)

### **2** Front Panel Fixing Screws

Before you press the power switch or install boards into the expansion slot, these screw are removed to detach the front panel

### **③** Power Switch

### (4) Expansion Slot

Optional video input or output main board is installed. (Video Input Board WJ-PB65C32 or Video Output Board WJ-PB65M16)

For WJ-SX650U, optional video input main board is installed. (Video Input Board WJ-PB65C32)

### **5 Video Input Board\***


This is a video input main board. This board controls cameras and alarm sensors (door switch, etc.).

**Note:** Refer to p. 11 WJ-PB65C32 Video Input Board for details.


### 6 Video Output Board\*

This is a video output main board. This board controls monitors and alarm output signals.

### ⑦ Video Input Board Rear Panels\*

These are video input rear boards.

#### Notes:

- When installing a set of video output board into the expansion slot of WJ-SX650, you will remove the IN B-3 board, and install the OUT X-3 board.

### 8 Expansion Slot

For WJ-SX650, optional video input or output rear boards are installed. (Video Input Board WJ-PB65C32 or Video Output Board WJ-PB65M16)

For WJ-SX650U, optional video input rear boards are installed. (Video Input Board WJ-PB65C32)

### **9 Video Output Board Rear Panels**

These are video output rear boards.

**Note:** Refer to p. 12 WJ-PB65M16 Video Output Board for details.

### 10 AC Inlet Socket (AC IN)


When using the unit, you will plug the power cord (supplied as a standard accessory) into this socket and connect the cord to an AC outlet.

### 1 Signal Ground Terminal (SIGNAL GND)

### ■ Video Input Board WJ-PB65C32

Video input board is composed of a main board (installed into the front side) and rear boards (x 3)(installed into the rear side).


### Board Number Switch (No.) Refer to p. 17 Switch Settings for Video Input Main Board for details.

② Input Mode Selection Switches (MODE) Set all switches to OFF.

### **③ Reset Switch (RESET)**

This button is pressed to reset this board.

**Note:** In normal operation, you need not press the button.



### IN A-3/IN B-3/IN C-3 board

- **Note:** These boards are originally installed into WJ-SX650 and WJ-SX650U, and not supplied to optional video input boards. (IN A-3 board is installed into WJ-SX650U only.)
- ④ Extension Ports 1 (EXTENSION 1: IN, OUT) These ports connect to an optional card cage.
- (5) **Termination Selector (TERM: ON, OFF)** Turns on or off the line termination of (4).
- (6) Extension Ports 2, 3 (EXTENSION 2, 3: IN, OUT) Each port connects to an optional card cage.
- RS-485 Camera Ports 1 to 4 (RS485 (CAMERA) 1 to 4)

These ports connect to RS-485 cameras.

8 RS-485 Camera Mode Switches 1 to 4 (MODE 1 to 4) These switches are moved to change the communication modes of (7).

### IN X-2 board

- (9) Video Output Ports 1 to 4 (VIDEO OUT 1 to 4) These ports loop through video input signals supplied to ①.
- Alarm Input Port (ALARM IN)
   Connects to an alarm sensor (door switch, etc.).

### IN X-1 board

 Camera Input Connectors 1 to 32 (CAMERA IN 1 to 32)


These connectors accept video input signals from cameras or recorders.

### ■ Video Output Board WJ-PB65M16

Video output board is composed of a main board (installed into the front side) and rear boards (x 3)(installed into the rear side).

### ① Output Mode Selection Switches (MODE)

Refer to p. 18 Switch Settings for Video Output Main Board for details.


### 2 Reset Switch (RESET)

This button is used only for factory tests. Do not press.

### Rear View

### ③ Test port (TEST)

This port is used only for factory tests. Do not connect anything.



### OUT X-3 board

- (4) Extension Ports 1 (EXTENSION 1: IN, OUT) These ports connect to an optional card cage.
- (5) Termination Selector (TERM: ON, OFF) Turns on or off the line termination of ④.
- ⑥ Data ports 1, 2 (DATA 1, 2) Each port connects to system controllers.
- ⑦ Data ports 3, 4 (DATA 3, 4) Each port connects to system controllers or recorders.
- 8 Rear Termination MODE Switches 1 to 4 (MODE 1 to 4)

Turns on or off the line termination of 6 and 7.

### OUT X-2 board

(9) Monitor Output Connectors (MONITOR OUT 1 to 16) These connectors connect to monitors.

### OUT X-1 board

- 10 Alarm Output Ports 1,2 (ALARM OUT 1, 2)
- Supplies alarm output signals.
- Accepts alarm recover input signals.
- Supplies and accepts the time adjust input and output signals.

### 1) VS Input Connector (VS IN)

Accepts a VS input signal from an external device.

VS Output Loop-thru Connector (VS OUT (THRU)) Loops through VS input signals supplied to ①.

### 13 VS Output Connector (VS OUT)

Supplies VS output signals to external devices. While ① is accepting a VS input signal, ③ supplies an output signal synchronizing the VS input signal. While ① is not accepting the VS input signal, ③ supplies an internal synchronization output signal.


(1) Serial Port (SERIAL)

Connects to a PC.

Note: When ① is set as Video Output Board 2, ④, ①, ②, ③, and ④ are not available.

### Monitor Display Information

The following are the details on terminal mode operations. For PS·Data operations, refer to p. 86 OPERATION (OTHER THAN TERMINAL MODE) or the operating instructions of system controllers.



#### **1** Time and Date Information

Current time and date are displayed. During daylight saving time (summer time), "\*" is dis-

played beside the time.

Example: 02/08/2005 \*20:15:56

**Note:** While a recorder is being selected, time and date are not displayed.

#### ② Monitor Status Information Monitor number

M01 to 32: Monitor number

**Note:** During monitor lock, monitor number is highlighted.

### **Controller information**

Displays a device that selects and controls the monitor. K1-1 to 8-4: Terminal mode system controller

(Example: For K8-4, "8" means the DATA port (TMNL) number and "4" means the controller number of system controller.)

PSD: PS·Data mode system controller

PC: PC connected to the SERIAL port

/T001 to 128: Timer event

#### Sequence number

Displays the active sequence number.

T01 to 32: Tour sequence number

G01 to 32: Group sequence number

**Note:** During sequence pause, "P" is displayed beside the sequence number.

#### 3 Camera Information Camera number

C001 to 999: Camera number R01 to 16: Recorder number

### Camera title

Displays the registered camera title. Camera title setting is performed in "Camera" – "Camera Title" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.

### (4) Event Information

TERMINAL001 to 256: Terminal alarm has occurred. (Example: For TERMINAL001, "001" means the number of alarm input signal accepted by the ALARM IN port of video input board.)

#### CAMERA001 to 999: Camera alarm has occurred. (Example: For CAMERA001, "001" means the number of camera supplying an alarm input signal to the unit.)

RECORDER001 to 999: Recorder alarm has occurred.

(Example: For RECORDER001, "001" means the number of camera associated with the recorder supplying an alarm input signal to the unit.)

SERIAL0001 to 1024: Serial alarm has occurred.

(Example: For SERIAL0001, "0001" means the serial command alarm input number.)

VIDEO LOSS001 to 999: Video loss has occurred.

(Example: For VIDEO LOSS001, "001" means the number of camera to which video loss has occurred)

SUSPEND: Alarm is suspended.


#### Notes:

- During the alarm acknowledgement (ACK) status (refer to p. 69), event information is highlighted.
- When two or more alarm events have occurred, "\*" is displayed beside the event information.

- 1 200 m {3 937 ft} is the total length limit of cables (between this unit and the system controller at the chain end).
- Up to 4 system controllers can be connected in the daisy chain. For system controllers in the daisy chain connection, operator registration is not available. (The same operator setting is applied for all the system controllers in the PS·Data daisy chain.)
- 2. If using only one system controller, set the MODE Switch #2 of DATA port connected to the system controller to ON. If using two or more system controllers in daisy chain connections, set the MODE Switch #2 of DATA port of the chain-end unit to ON.

- 3. Set the system controllers to the PS·Data mode. (Refer to the operating instructions of system controllers.)
- 4. Set the line termination of system controllers with the MODE switches. (Refer to the operating instructions of system controllers.) In the daisy chain connection, set the line termination of chain end system controller to ON. (Switch #5: ON)
- 5. In the daisy chain connection, set the CONTROLLER NO. switches of system controllers to 1 to 4. The switch setting must be different from each other. (Refer to the operating instructions of system controller for details on the CONTROLLER NO. switch setting.)
  - **Note:** When using system controllers in the PS·Data mode, camera numbers that can be selected differ depending on system controller models.

WV-CU950/650: 1 to 999 WV-CU360C/CJ: 1 to 199

Select the system controller models that are applicable for your system composition. When using 200 or more cameras in the PS·Data mode, apply WV-CU950/650.







• **Password:** For login, a password is checked as well as a User ID. Up to 5 digits are available.

**Note:** To protect system controllers from misuse, be sure to change the factory default passwords.

- Level: An operator's restrict level. 1 to 5 are available. 1 is the highest, and 5 is the lowest.
  - **Note:** Desired functions can be assigned to each level in "Operator" – "Level Table" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.
- **Priority:** Operator priority given to control a monitor, camera, or recorder selected by another operator. 1 to 99 are available. 1 is the highest, and 99 is the lowest.
- Camera Access: View and control can be enabled or disabled for each camera.

### • Group Sequence

Camera images are displayed on two or more monitors, and they are sequentially switched according to the setting.

- Up to 8 group sequences can be registered.
- Up to 32 steps can be set for a group sequence.



### Group Preset

Spot camera images are simultaneously displayed on two or more assigned monitors. Up to 24 (Group Sequence 9 to 32) group presets can be registered.

Sequence setting is performed in "Sequence" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console. The following settings are available for each sequence step.



- 2. Press the SEQ PAUSE<sup>\*1</sup> (or PAUSE<sup>\*2</sup>) button again to restart the sequence.

#### Available operations during sequence pause

- Sequence step forward/backward You can move the sequence one frame to the next or previous step by pressing the + or – button.

When a tour or group sequence is stopped, the camera at the stopped step will be selected. When a group sequence is stopped on a monitor, all sequences will be simultaneously stopped on other monitors.

### WV-CU950/650

Press the SEQ STOP button while holding down the SHIFT button. Sequence will be stopped.

### • WV-CU360C/CJ

Press the STOP button. Sequence will be stopped.

### Note

Sequence will also be stopped when you select a camera during the sequence is activated. Then, the image of selected camera will be displayed on the monitor.

# **Alarm Descriptions**

# Alarm Occurrence


When this unit accept an alarm input signal (terminal alarm, camera alarm, recorder alarm, serial alarm, or video loss), an alarm event (tour sequence, etc.) is activated automatically. Each alarm input signal is associated with an alarm event setting. (The setting activates the alarm input signal and alarm event.) Up to 1 024 alarm event settings are available. The alarm event setting is performed in "Alarm" – "Alarm Event" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.

By performing the settings of "Alarm Event", the following events will be activated when this unit accepts an alarm input signal.

- Alarm event information will be displayed on the associated monitors (Refer to p. 13 Monitor Display Information.)
- Depending on the setting of "Display Mode", camera images will be displayed, or sequences will be activated on the associated monitors. In this document, these actions are mentioned as the alarm mode, and pictures displayed during the alarm mode is mentioned as alarm pictures.
- Depending on the setting of "Recording Source (LCN)", event recording will be activated. (Recording will follow the command alarm setting and event recording setting of recorder. Refer to the operating instructions of recorder for details.)
- Depending on the setting of "Alarm Output", alarm output signal will be supplied from the video output board, and external alarm devices (buzzer, etc.) can be activated.

### Notes:

- To activate alarm output signals from the ALARM OUT 1/2 port, perform settings of No.1 to 64. No.65 and greater are assigned for serial commands.
- To activate alarm output signals as a serial command, serial command settings are required. The settings are performed in "Communication" – "Serial Command" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.
- ALARM indicators of all system controllers blink.
- Up to 10 000 alarm records are saved chronologically. The latest 1 000 alarm records can be displayed as the alarm history on the monitor. (Refer to p. 70 Alarm History Display.) The Alarm History can be downloaded from the PC to the unit.
- Alarm information is notified to the PC in serial commands. The serial command setting is performed in "Communication" "Serial Command" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.

# Alarm Modes


The following alarm modes ("Display Mode" settings) are available. (Alarm mode follows the setting of "Display Mode".)

# Spot

The image of associated camera will be displayed on the monitor. Preset position or auxiliary control will be activated. The following alarm modes (=patterns to display alarm pictures on a monitor) are available. (Regardless of alarm modes, alarms occur to all the associated cameras.) The alarm mode setting is performed in "Alarm" – "Alarm Mode" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console or the ALARM menu of SETUP MENU. The following illustration is the example in which alarms occur in the order of Alarm 1 \_ Alarm 2 \_ Alarm 3 \_ Alarm 4.

### Sequence mode

Alarm pictures are displayed sequentially (from the newest alarm picture) on the associated monitor.



### Earliest mode

The earliest alarm picture is displayed on the associated monitor.



### Latest mode

The latest alarm picture is displayed on the associated monitor.



## • Tour Sequence

Tour sequence is activated on the associated monitor.

# • Group Sequence/Preset

Group sequence is activated on the associated monitors.

# • OFF

Only the alarm information is displayed on the associated monitor. Alarm does not occur to monitors and cameras.

### Notes:

- When a tour sequence, group sequence, or group preset is activated as an alarm event, the earlier alarm event on the monitor will be reset.
- When 33 or more alarms (spot mode) occur to a monitor, older alarms will be reset chronologically.
- After occurrence, the same alarm will be suspended for 5 seconds.
- By the alarm schedule setting, alarm events can be deactivated in the specified periods. The alarm schedule setting is performed in "Alarm" – "Alarm Event" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.

# Video Loss

To display the video loss information on associated monitors and save the video loss history without making alarms occur to monitors and cameras, set "Display Mode" to OFF.

**Note:** If Alarm A ("Display Mode" is OFF) occurs while Alarm B's ("Display Mode" is Spot, Tour Sequence or Group Sequence) are being activated, the Alarm A information will be displayed on the monitor after all Alarm B's have been reset.

# **Alarm Control**

# ■ Alarm Acknowledgement (ACK)

By acknowledging an alarm occurrence on an associated monitor, you can control alarm pictures.

### • WV-CU950/650

While a monitor in the alarm mode status is selected, press the ACK button. (During the alarm mode status, "Alarm" sign is blinking on the LCD.)

In the ACK status, the following operations are available.

# Camera Control

You can control panning/tilting of cameras, or move cameras to preset positions, etc.

# Alarm Picture Change

When two or more alarms are occurring, you can change alarm pictures displayed on the monitor in order or reverse order.

### • WV-CU950/650

To change alarm pictures on the monitor, press the + or – button. The alarm pictures will be displayed in order or reverse order.

### • WV-CU360C/CJ

To change alarm pictures on the monitor, press the NEXT or PREV button. The alarm pictures will be displayed in order or reverse order.

### Alarm Individual Reset

You can reset each acknowledged alarm separately, and return to the status before alarm occurrence. While two or more alarms are occurring, the system will remain in the alarm mode even after an alarm reset.

To reset an acknowledged alarm, press the ACK button. The alarm will be reset.

#### Notes:

- An alarm whose Display Mode setting is OFF will not be the ACK status. The alarm will be reset by every pressing the ACK button.
- If AUTO RESET has been set to ON, alarms will be reset automatically after the specified time. AUTO RESET setting is performed in "Alarm" – "Alarm Mode" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console or the ALARM menu of SETUP MENU. Refer to p. 50 ALARM of SETUP MENU.

### Alarm Monitor Reset

You can reset all the alarms occurred to the selected monitor.

While the selected monitor is in the alarm mode status, press the ALM RESET<sup>\*1</sup> (or RESET<sup>\*2</sup>) button. All the alarms occurred to the monitor will be reset, and the monitor display will return to the status before the alarm occurrence. \*<sup>1</sup> WV-CU950/650 \*<sup>2</sup> WV-CU360C/CJ

**Note:** Alarm monitor reset is also available by supplying Alarm Recover Input signals to the unit. (Refer to p. 37.)

### Alarm All Reset

You can reset all the alarms occurred to the system.





# **Operation (Other than Terminal Mode)**

This chapter includes notifications on operations from system controllers in the PS·Data mode, a web browser accessing the recorder, or a PC.

### ■ PS·Data Mode Operations

**Note:** When using a system controller in the PS·Data mode, check the software version.

The available software versions are as follows. **WV-CU950/650:** Ver. 2.00 or later

WV-CU360C/CJ: Ver. 8.10 or later

The following is the restrictions of PS·Data mode operations. Refer to the operating instructions of system controller for details.

#### • Login

Log into the system by entering the user ID and password registered in the system controller. After login, you can control the unit as a PS·Data operator. PS·Data operator setting is performed in "Operator" – "Operator" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.

#### Logout

Auto logout is not available. Log out from the system manually.

#### Camera selection

When using WV-CU360C/CJ, you cannot select Camera 200 or greater.

#### Camera position

When using WV-CU950/650, camera positions registered in the system controller are activated. (Up to 999 camera positions are available.) This function is not available with WV-CU360C/CJ.

#### Camera selection recall

Camera selection steps are memorized in the system controller. (Even when you select another monitor, the memorized steps are not cleared.) This function is not available with WV-CU360C/CJ.

#### Preset

When using WV-CU360C/CJ, you cannot select Preset Position 065 or greater.

#### Recorder selection

You cannot select a recorder by entering the recorder number. To select the recorder, enter the logical camera number associated with the camera input channel connected to the recorder.

#### Recorder control

When using WV-CU360C/CJ, refer to the operating instructions of recorder.

#### Alarm

Alarm ACK, Alarm Individual Reset, and Alarm Monitor Reset are not available. (Alarm All Reset is available.) When controlling Alarm History Display from WV-CU360C/CJ, you cannot skip to 10 pages forward or backward. (Refer to p. 77.)

#### Error message display

When you fail in operations, error messages (Not Avail and Prohibited) will not be displayed on the LCD (or LED display).

#### Camera control level restriction

Camera Setup and Preset Position Registration is not restricted separately by the user level setting. To restrict them, set Camera Control to "Disabled". User level setting is performed in "Operator" – "Level Table" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.

#### Other functions

You cannot control the following functions by pressing the associated buttons on system controllers. Control them by entering the system function numbers. (When using WV-CU950/650, you can specify the system functions marked with "\*" either by pressing the numeric buttons or recalling the menu functions on the LCD.)

- 1. Enter the system function number by pressing the numeric buttons.
- 2. Press the SYS FUNC<sup>\*1</sup> (or FUNCTION<sup>\*2</sup>) button while holding down the SHIFT button.



### ■ Connections of Matrix Switchers (WJ-SX650 Series) and a PS-Data System Controller

By connecting a PS·Data system controller (WV-CU950/650, CONTROLLER NO.: 1) to the DATA ports of the units with Cable Kit WV-CA48/10K, you can control these units from the system controller. (Refer to p. 36 for details on connections.)

#### Notes:

- Connect Cable Kit WV-CA48/10K to the DATA 1 port.
- Set the DATA 1 port of each unit to PSD. Setting changes are performed in "System" "DATA Port" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console or DATA PORT (refer to p. 53) of SETUP MENU.



#### **Connections and Operations**

- When controlling two or more units from a PS Data system controller, you need to select a unit before operation. To select a unit, enter a unit address by pressing the numeric buttons. Then, press the RECORDER/UNIT button while holding down the SHIFT button.
- The unit address setting of each unit must be different from each other. The unit address settings are performed in "Communication" "PS.Data" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.
- When an alarm occurs to a unit, other units will accept the alarm as a serial alarm input.
- User level settings for alarm suspension must be the same within all the units.
- The LCN settings must be different among all the units. (Up to LCN 999 are available.) The LCN settings are performed in "System" "Logical Camera Number" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.
- When activating AUTO RESET, set the parameter to 3 sec or longer. (Refer to p.50.)

### Controlling from a Web Browser Accessing a Recorder

If a recorder is connected to the unit, you can control cameras using a web browser of a PC accessing the recorder. You can set priority for web browser control. Priority setting is performed in "Operator" – "Operator" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.

#### Notes:

- Refer to the operating instructions of recorder for details on browser control.
- When using WJ-RT416 Series, use the monitoring software.
- Refer to the operating instructions of the monitoring software for further information about operations.
- Regardless of priority setting, during the recorder control from a system controller, camera control is not available from a web browser accessing recorders connected to the same DATA port in the daisy chain.

### ■ Controlling from a PC

You can perform the operations and functions of system controllers by logging into the system and sending RS-232C commands from a PC connected to the unit. Refer to Serial (RS-232C) Connector Command Reference (PDF file on the supplied CD-ROM) for available commands.

### Glossary

This document uses the following terms.

- Monitor number: Numbers (MON 1 to 32) given to the MONITOR OUT connectors of Video Output Board 1 and 2 for monitor selection
- Logical Camera number (LCN): Numbers set for the CAM-ERA IN connectors (CAM 1 to 256) of Video Input Board 1 to 8 for camera selection. As the factory default, LCN 1 to 256 are given to the CAM 1 to 256 in numerical order.
  - Note: LCN setting changes are performed in "System" "Logical Camera Number" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.
- Recorder number: Unit Address (System) numbers (Recorder 1 to 16) set for recorders in SETUP MENU of recorders for recorder selection. In this document, "Unit Address (System) 001" is mentioned as "Recorder 1".

Level: Refer to p. 56.

Priority: Refer to p. 56.

- Camera Access: Refer to p. 56.
- Recorder Access: Refer to p. 56.

Login: Refer to p. 57.

Logout: Refer to p. 57.

- Auto login: Function to log into the system automatically as a registered operator. Refer to p. 57.
- Auto logout: Function to log out of the system automatically after no operations have been performed during the specified period. Refer to p. 57.
- **Camera Title:** Titles for camera identification, which are displayed on associated monitors, can be set up. Up to 20 characters are available for the camera title. Camera title setting will be performed in "Camera" "Camera Title" of WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.

Monitor lock: Refer to p. 58.

- **Preset (Preset position):** Camera's function to register camera monitoring positions (preset positions) associated with position numbers. By entering the preset position numbers, operators can move cameras to the preset positions. (Refer to p. 59.) Registered preset positions can be applied for event settings such as sequence.
- **Home position:** Default preset position. If the home position is registered, you can move the camera to the home position without specifying the preset position number.
- Auxiliary (AUX) control: You can control auxiliary devices (buzzer, etc.) connected to cameras or receivers. (Refer to p. 80.) Auxiliary control can be applied for event settings such as sequence.
- Auto tracking: Camera's function to detect motion of the image and track the moving object automatically. Refer to p. 72 and the operating instructions of cameras supporting this function.
- **Patrol:** Camera's function to learn and reproduce camera operations and picture quality. (Refer to pp. 72 and 79.)

- **Cleaning (Camera Cleaning):** Function to clean the slip ring to eliminate picture quality deterioration and noise. (Available for Panasonic cameras released in 1999 or later)
- **Camera position:** You can associate camera numbers with preset position numbers to register as camera positions (CAM-P).

Camera selection recall: Refer to p. 59.

- **All cameras control:** You can deactivate all auxiliary devices at a time, or move all cameras to the home positions. Refer to p. 60.
- **Spot:** A selected camera image is continuously displayed on a selected monitor.

Tour sequence: Refer to p. 63.

- Group sequence: Refer to p. 63.
- Group preset: Refer to p. 63.
- Alarm signal: General term for terminal alarm, camera alarm, recorder alarm, serial alarm, and video loss.
- **Terminal alarm:** Alarm input signals which are supplied from alarm sensors (door switch, etc.) to the alarm input (ALARM IN) ports of the unit.
- **Camera alarm:** Alarm input signals which are supplied from cameras to the unit by alarm sensors or cameras' motion detectors, etc.
- **Recorder alarm:** Alarm input signals which are supplied from recorders to the unit by video loss or VMD, etc.
- Serial alarm: Alarm input signals which are supplied as serial commands from a PC to the SERIAL port of the unit. Alarm commands which are input from the DATA ports set to PSD are also serial alarms. (Refer to p. 87.)
- Video loss: Alarm input signals which are supplied to the unit when the loss of video input signals are detected due to coaxial cable disconnections or camera troubles.

Alarm event: Refer to p. 67.

- Alarm schedule: Function to schedule the period when no alarm events occur even with alarm input signals
- **Monitor display mode:** Display mode which can be activated for alarm events during alarm occurrence. There are three types of alarm modes: spot, tour sequence, and group sequence. These modes can be set separately for each monitor.
- Alarm suspension: Operation to suspend alarm occurrence to the unit.
- Alarm History Display: Refer to p. 70.

System Status Display: Refer to p. 38.

Timer event: Refer to p. 72.

- Camera event: Refer to p. 72.
- **VD2:** Timing pulse to display the images of Panasonic cameras on the monitor. If VD2 is set to ON, image switching unconformity can be prevented. (Depending on monitors, the unconformity may not be solved completely.)
- **Cable compensation:** If coaxial cables connected between the cameras and the unit are longer than the suitable length, video input signals may be attenuated.

Cable compensation is the function to compensate the attenuation.

- **Export:** Function to save the settings of tour sequence or group sequence in export files (csv format). This function is available when using WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console. Export is performed separately for each sequence program.
- **Import:** Function to read export files (csv format) into WJ-SX650 Series Administrator Console.


