

## Preface

This product is an outdoor use PTZ (PAN, TILT, ZOOM) network camera with a 10BASE-T/100BASE-TX network port for network connection.

By connecting to a network (LAN) or the Internet, images and audio from the camera can be monitored on a PC via a network.

### Note:

- It is necessary to configure the network settings of the PC and its network environment to monitor images from the camera on the PC. It is also necessary to install a web browser on the PC.

## About notations

The following notations are used when describing the functions limited for specified models. The functions without the notations are supported by all models.

**X6533** The functions with this notation are available when using the model WV-X6533LN.

**S6532** The functions with this notation are available when using the model WV-S6532LN.

## Main functions

### **40x optical zoom **X6533** , 22x optical zoom **S6532** and the high accuracy preset position function that uses a gear drive**

Enables monitoring of a wide area using a single camera, and reduces the maintenance cost because of the use of a gear drive with a high durability.

### **High performance IR LED light and visible light cutoff filter are installed**

With the high performance IR LED light, it is possible to record in the night a distance of 350m {Approx. 1150 ft}\*1 **X6533** / 100m {Approx. 330 ft} **S6532** . Further, the visible light cutoff filter can reduce defocussing and blown out whites are reduced during infrared record.

### **Stabilizer using gyro sensor and image vector detection adopted **X6533****

Intelligent Zoom Stabilization using a gyro sensor and image vector detection enables correcting low-frequency vibration of the poles caused by wind or fine vibration generated when high magnification is set, and shooting with less blurring can be achieved.

Refer to “Stabilizer” of Operating Instructions for descriptions of how to set Intelligent Zoom Stabilization.

### **ClearSight coating (rain wash coating)\*2 for front panel adopted**

The rain wash coating is a special coating applied to the surface of the front panel that makes it difficult for water droplets to adhere to the front panel.

**The camera conforms to the IP66\*<sup>3</sup> and Type 4X (UL50E)\*<sup>4</sup>, is compliant with NEMA 4X\*<sup>5</sup> ratings, and provides high dust resistance and waterproof performance.**

Waterproofing treatment is not required for the camera body (Waterproofing treatment is required for all cable connection parts except for Ethernet cable).

**Achieves high-level shock resistance with IK10\*<sup>6</sup> (IEC 62262) conformity.**

The camera has a strong shock resistance body which is needed in outdoor installations.

**Delivers high image quality streaming at low bit rates thanks to a H.265 engine equipped with Panasonic's own Smart Facial Coding technology\*<sup>7</sup>.**

This allows H.265 compression in addition to conventional H.264 compression technology, and when combined with Smart Facial Coding, reduces data load compared to our previous models.

**Panasonic's own intelligent auto (iA) feature provides increased discernibility even in environments with poor visibility**

Improvements to the Super Dynamic (SD) feature and shutter speed optimization provides clear discernibility even when monitoring moving people or car silhouettes or when license plates are illuminated by car headlights. Also, face recognition under the condition where brightness of the background changes is enabled by a function of recognizing face position and adjusting the brightness automatically.

**Equipped with SD slot**

It is possible to save H.265 / H.264 videos and JPEG images on the SD memory card manually when an alarm occurs, during the period of the schedule, or on a Web browser. (Downloading is possible.) It is also possible to save JPEG images if a network failure occurs.

**Encryption and alteration detection functions enhanced the security.**

\*2 The rain wash coating is only effective against water (rain water) and is not effective against other substances such as oil or damage to the front panel.

\*4 Type 4X (UL50E): 4X indicates the rank in the UL waterproof standard.

\*5 NEMA 4X: Dust resistance and waterproof performance standards set by National Electrical Manufacturers Association (United States).

\*6 IK10: is a standard in regards to shock resistance that represents the level of impact protection, and is regulated by the International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC).

\*7 This technology allows the camera to learn the location of faces and moving objects, and transmit only the face portion of the image in high definition, thereby greatly reducing the bandwidth required.

Otherwise, the mounting portions will deteriorate and accidents such as a fall of the product may occur.

## **Do not strike or give a strong shock to this product.**

Failure to observe this may cause fire or injury.

## **Keep SDXC/SDHC/SD memory cards away from infants and children.**

Otherwise, they may swallow the cards by mistake. In this case, consult a doctor immediately.



## **[Precautions for use]**

### **When the product is accessible from the Internet**

To prevent unauthorized access, note the following.

- Leave user authentication turned on.
- Periodically change passwords that are used to access the product.

Refer to the Operating Instructions on the Panasonic support website for information about how to change passwords.

### **To keep on using with stable performance**

Do not use this product in hot and humid conditions for a long time. Failure to observe this causes component degradation resulting in life shortening of this product. Do not expose this product to direct heat sources such as a heater.

### **This product has no power switch.**

When turning off the power, disconnect the power supply from the 24 V AC power supply, the tested PoE injector or the PoE+ device.

### **Turning the power supply ON and OFF frequently can lead to malfunctions.**

### **Handle this product with care.**

Do not drop this product, nor apply shock or vibration to the product. Failure to observe this may cause trouble.

### **About the battery**

A battery is installed inside the camera. Do not leave the battery exposed in environments of excessive heat as a result of sunlight or fire.

### **Do not subject the front panel to strong impact.**

Doing so may cause damage or immersion.

### **Do not touch the front panel directly with your bare hands.**

A dirty front panel causes deterioration of picture quality.

### **When an error is detected, this product will restart automatically.**

This product will be inoperable for around 2 minutes after the restart just as when the power is turned on.

### **About the automatic status detection function**

When this product malfunctions due to exogenous noise, etc. for 30 seconds or more, the product will automatically reset and will return to normal state. When the product is reset, initialization will be carried out as when the power of the product is turned on. When the product repeatedly resets, exogenous noise level around the product may be high and that may cause malfunction. Contact your dealer for instructions.

### **Periodically images on the screen appear to be distorted**

When the camera is installed in a location where it is subject to small vibrations (for example, when it is installed near devices that vibrate), images may appear distorted and stretched lengthways. This phenomenon is a characteristic of image pickup devices that use CMOS sensors and is caused by the relationship between the periodic movements of the camera and the timing that the image sensor reads images. This is not a problem with the camera. To reduce the possibility of this phenomenon occurring, install the camera in a secure location.

### **What to do if “WARMING UP-PLEASE WAIT” appears on the display.**

This message indicates that the temperature inside the camera has become extremely low. The camera will be automatically restarted when the inside the camera is warmed up by the built-in heater. Please wait for a while.

**We shall not be liable for content compensation, losses of recorded or edited content and any direct or indirect consequent damages caused by failure to record or edit due to faults with this unit or the SD memory card. In addition, the same provisions apply after unit is repaired.**

## About the CMOS image sensor

- When continuously shooting a bright light source such as a spotlight, the color filter of the CMOS image sensor may become deteriorated and this may cause discoloration. Even when changing the fixed shooting direction after continuously shooting a spotlight for a certain period, the discoloration may remain.
- When shooting fast-moving subjects or performing panning/tilting operations, objects crossing the shooting area may look to be bending askew.

## Cleaning this product body

Be sure to turn off the power before cleaning. Failure to observe this may cause injury. Do not use benzine, thinner, alcohol, or any other types of solvents or detergents. Otherwise, it may cause discoloration. When using a chemical cloth for cleaning, read the caution provided with the chemical cloth product.

- Do not loosen or remove screws unless instructed to do so in the product documentation.
- The camera position may be moved inadvertently while cleaning the camera body. Restart the product or refresh the camera position (position refresh) to correct the camera position. Refer to the Operating Instructions on the the Panasonic support website for further information.

## Cleaning of the front panel

- When cleaning the front panel, hose or spray fresh water that is not containing lubricant agent or silicon substances and wash away adherents such as grain of sand. If dirt is hard to remove, use a sponge soaked into the fresh water mentioned above and wipe off.
- Do not wipe the cover with a dry cloth. (Using dry cloth may spread oil constituent adhered to the surface, and it may result in damaging the ClearSight coating (rain wash coating).)

- If dirt cannot be wiped off with a damp cloth, use a neutral detergent for kitchen utensils, and sufficiently rinse off the detergent.

When using a detergent containing wax components such as detergent for washing cars, a detergent with polishing material such as a compound, etc., and a non-neutral (weakly acidic or weakly alkaline) detergent, it can decrease the hydrophilic property and peel off the surface coating.

- Do not use organic solvent such as benzene and thinner.
- Before using a spray, abandon a few sprays to eliminate impurities.
- Improper cleaning of the front panel may cause the ClearSight coating (rain wash coating) to become less effective. In this case, in order to have effective ClearSight coating (rain wash coating), a new front panel must be purchased to replace the existing front panel. Consult with your dealer or construction contractor.

## About the stabilizer function

Depending on the conditions in the installation area, effects of the stabilizer function may not be fully achieved.

## Consumable parts

The following are consumables: Replace them in accordance with their operating lifetimes. Their operating lifetimes vary depending on the usage environment and conditions. The operating lifetimes below are just guides for when using the camera at +35 °C {95 °F}.

- Lens unit, panning motor, tilting motor: Approx. 3.7 million operations (Approx. 20000 hours)  
Cooling fan: Approx. 52000 hours  
Slip ring: Approx. 3.7 million operations (Approx. 20000 hours)
- When continuing the action of moving the set position for a long period, dust may accumulate in a slip ring. It can be prevented by executing the position refresh action regularly (about once a week) using the schedule setting.

### **Product disposal/transfer**

Data saved on this product or a storage device used with this product may lead to personal information leakage. When it is necessary to dispose or give this product to someone, even when for repair, make sure that there is no data on this product.

When abandoning the memory media, it is recommended to destroy it physically after deleting data by PC.

### **Lens and pan/tilt head**

If a lens and pan/tilt head are not performed for a long period of time, the grease coating inside these parts may become sticky. That may obstruct the parts from moving. To prevent this, move the lens or pan/tilt head periodically. Or perform position refresh periodically in the manner described in "Position refresh".

### **Position refresh**

During the use for a long period of time, the preset positions may become inaccurate. When "Position refresh" is set for the created schedule, the camera position will be corrected periodically. Refer to the Operating Instructions on the the Panasonic support website for how to perform the settings.

### **Equipment classification and power source indication label**

Refer to the indication label inside the SD slot cover at the rear part of this unit for the equipment classification, power source, and other information.

# Precautions for installation

**Panasonic assumes no responsibility for injuries or property damage resulting from failures arising out of improper installation or operation inconsistent with this documentation.**

**For information about the installation tasks, refer to the provided Installation Guide.**

**In order to prevent injury, the product must be securely mounted to a wall or ceiling according to Installation Guide.**

**This equipment is not suitable for use in locations where children are likely to be present.**

**Mount the bracket higher than 3.0 m {9.84 feet} from the ground.**

## Power supply

This product has no power switch.

When performing electrical work, make sure the camera can be turned on and off. When an Ethernet cable or power cable is connected, the power is turned on. When the product is supplied, the product will perform panning, tilting, zooming and focusing.

When cleaning the product, remove the Ethernet cable or disconnect the power cable from the main power supply.

## Installation area for this product

Select an appropriate place for the installation area (such as a strong wall or ceiling) in your particular environment.

- When hanging the camera from a ceiling, use the WV-Q121B (option) ceiling mount bracket.
- When installing on a wall, use wall mount bracket WV-Q122A (option).
- When pendant-mounting on a ceiling on a bracket that is custom-made, use the attachment pipe.
- Make sure that the installation area is strong enough to hold this product, such as a concrete ceiling.
- Install the camera in the foundation area of the architecture or where sufficient strength is assured.

- Do not mount the product on a plaster board or a wooden section because they are too weak. If the product is unavoidably mounted on such a section, the section shall be sufficiently reinforced.

## When using the camera in combination with an attachment pipe and attaching to a locally procured bracket

- Locally procure a M6 eye bolt (stainless steel).  
Minimum pull-out strength (per 1 pc.):  
1411 N {317 lbf}
- In order to prevent the camera from falling, procure a bracket that can be attached a safety wire.
- Connect the M6 eye bolt and locally procured bracket together with the safety wire.
- Check that the surface that the attachment pipe and locally procured bracket are to be attached to can bear the weight of the bracket and camera.

## Mounting method for this product

This product is designed to be used as a pendant mount camera. If the product is mounted on a desktop or at a slant, it may not work correctly and its lifetime may be shortened.

## **Do not place this product in the following places:**

- Locations where a chemical agent is used such as a swimming pool
- Locations subject to moisture or oil smoke such as a kitchen
- Locations that have a specific environment that is subject to an inflammable atmosphere or solvents
- Locations where a radiation, an X-ray, a strong radio wave or a strong magnetic field is generated
- Locations near coasts directly subjected to sea breezes, or locations subject to corrosive gases such as from hot springs, volcanic regions, etc.
- Locations where the temperature is not within the specified range (☞ page 32)
- Locations subject to vibrations, such as on vehicles, marine vessels, or above product lines (This product is not designed for on-vehicle use.)
- Locations subject to condensation as the result of severe changes in temperature (In case of installing the product in such locations, the front panel may become foggy or condensation may be caused on the panel.)

## **Sulfurization caused by rubber products**

Do not place the product near rubber products (packing, rubber feet, etc.) that contain sulfur. There is a risk that sulfur components in rubber products may cause electrical parts and terminals, etc. to become sulfurized and corrode.

## **Screw tightening**

- The screws and bolts must be tightened with an appropriate tightening torque according to the material and strength of the installation area.
- Do not use an impact driver. Use of an impact driver may damage the screws or cause tightening excessively.
- When a screw is tightened, make the screw at a right angle to the surface. After tightening the screws or bolts, perform checks to ensure that the tightening is sufficient enough so that there is no movement or looseness.

## **Heater unit**

This product is equipped with an internal heater unit for use in cold climates.

The heater unit turns on automatically when the temperature inside the product drops below +10 °C {50 °F}. When this product is installed and operated in low temperatures below -20 °C {-4 °F}, it may require time to start up since the camera will wait to be warmed up internally by the internal heater right after the power is turned on. Also, the camera may not function properly, if it is installed and operated in an environment where the temperature is below -30 °C {-22 °F}. In such a case, wait approximately 2 hours or more until the camera is warmed up. Then, turn on the power again. As the camera warms up, snow or frost accumulated on the front panel will melt. However, it may not be defrosted from the panel depending on the ambient temperature or weather condition.

## **When installing the product in cold climates**

When using IR LED light in very cold regions, it is recommended to use along with an AC power supply or a tested PoE injector.

- The heater does not operate when using a PoE + device.

## **Effects on images and image quality**

Under the following conditions, image quality may deteriorate or images may become difficult to see.

- When there are raindrops on the front panel due to wind during rainfall.
- When there is snow on the front panel due to wind during snowfall. (varies depending on the amount and quality of snowfall).
- When the front panel is dirty due to dust in the air or vehicle exhaust.

### About reflection of light from outside or IR light

Depending on the incident angle of high intensity light source such as sunlight or lighting, images of non-existing objects (reflected light) or reflections of surroundings on the camera lens (ghost) may sometimes appear on the screen. Especially in the case of LED light, these phenomena may be seen remarkably. In the case of using the IR light, installation of a camera near a wall may cause reflection of infrared rays resulting in a part of the screen or the entire screen turning whitish. Therefore, consider the installation place carefully.



### Protection from lightning

When cables are used outdoors, there is a chance that they may be affected by lightning. In such a case, install a lightning arrester close to the camera, and make the length of the network cable between the camera and lightning arrester as short as possible to prevent the camera from being damaged by lightning.

### Grounding connection of the lightning arrester

With the camera mount bracket connected to the earth ground, connect the ground of the lightning arrester (locally procured) to the following location of this unit. Procure locally all the screws used for connecting. Recommended fixing screws: M3×8 mm with spring washer



### Take notice of humidity

Install this product when the humidity is low. If installation is performed when it is raining or in very humid conditions, the inside may be affected by humidity, causing mist-over inside the front panel.

### When noise disturbance may happen

Conduct the power distribution work to keep a distance of 1 m {3.28 feet} or more from the 120 V (for U.S. and Canada) or 220 V – 240 V (for Europe and other countries) power line. Or conduct the electric conduit work separately (Always connect the metal pipe with grounding).

### Radio disturbance

Noise may appear in video or audio near a strong electric field from a TV or radio antenna, motors and transformers, or a strong electric field/magnetic field from a power line (lamp line) of AC100 V or more.

### PoE+ (Power over Ethernet Plus)

Use a PoE+ hub / device that is compliant with IEEE802.3at standard.

It is impossible to supply the power to this product from a PoE hub that is compliant with IEEE802.3af standard.

### Router

When connecting this product to the Internet, use a broadband router with the port forwarding function (NAT, IP masquerade). Refer to the Operating Instructions on the Panasonic support website for further information about the port forwarding function.



### ① RJ45 (female) Network cable

Connect an Ethernet cable (category 5e or better, straight) to the network connector.

#### IMPORTANT:

- Use all 4 pairs (8 pins) of the Ethernet cable.
- The maximum length of the Ethernet cable (locally procured) is 100 m {Approx. 328 ft}.
- Make sure that the PoE+ device in use is compliant with IEEE802.3at standard.
- When connecting both the 24 V AC power supply and the PoE+ device for power supply, 24 V AC will be used for power supply.
- When the Ethernet cable is disconnected once, reconnect the cable after around 2 seconds. When the cable is quickly reconnected, the power may not be supplied from the PoE+ device.

## ■ Indicators and Switch
