

# Preface

This product is an indoor use PTZ (PAN, TILT, ZOOM) type monitoring camera with a 10BASET/ 100BASE-TX network port for network connection.

By connecting to a network (LAN) or the Internet, images and audio from the camera can be monitored on a PC via a network.

#### Note:

 It is necessary to configure the network settings of the PC and its network environment to monitor images from the camera on the PC. It is also necessary to install a web browser on the PC.

# **About notations**

The following notations are used when describing the functions limited for specified models. The functions without the notations are supported by all models.

S6131 The functions with this notation are available when using the model WV-S6131.

S6111 The functions with this notation are available when using the model WV-S6111.

# **Main functions**

A single camera provides wide area monitoring.

This allows H.265 compression in addition to conventional H.264 compression technology, and when combined with Smart Facial Coding, reduces data load compared to our previous models.

# Our own intelligent auto (iA) feature provides increased discernibility even in environments with poor visibility

Improvements to the Super Dynamic (SD) feature and shutter speed optimization provides clear discernibility even when monitoring moving people or car silhouettes or when license plates are illuminated by car headlights. Also, face recognition under the condition where brightness of the background changes is enabled by a function of recognizing face position and adjusting the brightness automatically.

#### Equipped with SD memory card slot

It is possible to save H.265 / H.264 videos and JPEG images on the SD memory card manually when an alarm occurs, during the period of the schedule, or on a Web browser. (Downloading is possible.) It is also possible to save JPEG images if a network failure occurs.

#### Encryption and alteration detection functions enhanced the security.

\*1 This technology allows the camera to learn the location of faces and moving objects, and transmit only the face portion of the image in high definition, thereby greatly reducing the bandwidth required.

#### To keep on using with stable performance

Do not use this product in hot and humid conditions for a long time. Failure to observe this causes component degradation resulting in life shortening of this product. Do not expose this product to direct heat sources such as a heater.

This product is designed to be used indoors. This product is not operable outdoors.

#### Make sure that the product does not become wet.

Keep this camera away from water and moisture.

#### This product has no power switch.

When turning off the power, disconnect the power supply from the 12 V DC power supply or the PoE device.

#### Handle this product with care.

Do not drop this product, nor apply shock or vibration to the product. Failure to observe this may cause trouble.

#### About the battery

A battery is installed inside the camera. Do not leave the battery exposed in environments of excessive heat as a result of sunlight or fire.



#### Do not touch the lens surface with your bare hands.

A dirty lens surface causes deterioration of picture quality.

#### Do not touch the dome cover with your bare hands.

A dirty dome cover causes deterioration of picture quality.

#### When an error is detected, this product will restart automatically.

This product will be inoperable for around 2 minutes after the restart just as when the power is turned on.

#### About the automatic status detection function

When this product malfunctions due to exogenous noise, etc. for 30 seconds or more, the product will automatically reset and will return to normal state. When the product is reset, initialization will be carried out as when the power of the product is turned on. When the product repeatedly resets, exogenous noise level around the product may be high and that may cause malfunction. Contact your dealer for instructions.

#### Periodically images on the screen appear to be distorted

When the camera is installed in a location where it is subject to small vibrations (for example, when it is installed near devices that vibrate). images may appear distorted and stretched lengthways. This phenomenon is a characteristic of image pickup devices that use MOS sensors and is caused by the relationship between the periodic movements of the camera and the timing that the image sensor reads images. This is not a problem with the camera. To reduce the possibility of this phenomenon occurring, install the camera in a secure location.

We shall not be liable for content compensation, losses of recorded or edited content and any direct or indirect consequent damages caused by failure to record or edit due to faults with this unit or the SD memory card. In addition, the same provisions apply after unit is reparied.

#### About the MOS image sensor

- When continuously shooting a bright light source such as a spotlight, the color filter of the MOS image sensor may become deteriorated and this may cause discoloration. Even when changing the fixed shooting direction after continuously shooting a spotlight for a certain period. the discoloration may remain.
- When shooting fast-moving subjects or objects crossing the shooting area may look to be bending askew.

#### Cleaning this product body

Be sure to turn off the power before cleaning. Failure to observe this may cause injury. Do not use benzine, thinner, alcohol, or any other types of solvents or detergents. Otherwise, it may cause discoloration. When using a chemical cloth for cleaning, read the caution provided with the chemical cloth product.

- \* Do not loozen or remove screws unless instructed to do so in the product documentation.
- \* The camera position may be moved inadvertently while cleaning the camera body. Restart the camera or refresh the camera position (position refresh) to correct the camera position. Refer to the Operating Instructions (included in the CD-ROM) for further information.

### Cleaning the lens

Use a lens cleaning paper (used to clean camera lenses or lenses of spectacles). When using solvent, use an alcohols solvent and do not use a thinner or a glass cleaner.

#### Cleaning of the dome cover

Use lens cleaning paper (used to clean camera or spectacles lenses) to remove any dirt on the dome cover

#### About the stabilizer function

Depending on the conditions in the installation area, effects of the stabilizer function may not be fully achieved.

#### Consumable parts

The following are consumables: Replace them in accordance with their operating lifetimes. Their operating lifetimes vary depending on the usage environment and conditions. The operating lifetimes below are just guides for when using the camera at +35 °C {95 °F}.

#### S6131 S6111

- Lens unit, panning motor, tilting motor, flat cable for tilting, slip ring: Approx. 3.7 million operations (Approx. 20000 hours)
- \* When continuing the action of moving the set position for a long period, dust may accumulate on a slip ring. It can be prevented by executing the position refresh action regularly (about once a week) using the schedule setting.

#### S6130

 Lens unit, panning motor, tilting motor, flat cable for panning, flat cable for tilting: Approx. 3.7 million operations (Approx. 20000 hours)

#### Do not hold the dome section.

The dome section of this unit rotates. When removing this unit from a ceiling or wall, turn the unit while holding the fixed section.

#### Motor operating sound

The operating sound may be louder depending on the speed of panning/tilting operations. When you feel uneasy, the operating sound can be diminished by reducing the setting value of auto panning speed.

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#### Lens and pan/tilt head

If a lens and pan/tilt head are not performed for a long period of time, the grease coating inside these parts may become sticky. That may obstruct the parts from moving. To prevent this, move the lens or pan/tilt head periodically. Or perform position refresh.

#### Position refresh

During the use for a long period of time, the preset positions may become inaccurate. When "Position refresh" is set for the created schedule, the camera position will be corrected periodically. Refer to the Operating Instructions on the provided CD-ROM for how to perform the settings.

# Equipment classification and power source indication label

Refer to the indication label on the bottom side of this unit for the equipment classification, power source, and other information.

#### Product disposal/transfer

Data saved on this product or a storage device used with this product may lead to personal information leakage. When it is necessary to dispose or give this product to someone, even when for repair, make sure that there is no data on this product.

# **Precautions for installation**

i-PRO Co., Ltd. assumes no responsibility for injuries or property damage resulting from failures arising out of improper installation or operation inconsistent with this documentation. For information about the installation tasks, refer to the provided Installation Guide.

In order to prevent injury, the product must be securely mounted to a wall or ceiling according to Installation Guide. (Except for placing WV-S6130 upside-down)

#### Power supply

This product has no power switch. When performing electrical work, make sure the camera can be turned on and off. When an Ethernet cable or power cable is connected, the power is turned on. When the power is supplied, the product will perform panning, tilting, zooming and focusing. When cleaning the product, remove the Ethernet cable or disconnect the power cable from the main power supply.

#### Installation area for this product

Select an appropriate place for the installation area (such as a strong wall or ceiling) in your particular environment.

- Make sure that the installation area is strong enough to hold this product, such as a concrete ceiling.
- Install the camera in the foundation area of the architecture or where sufficient strength is assured.
- Do not mount the product on a plaster board or a wooden section because they are too weak. If the product is unavoidably mounted on such a section, the section shall be sufficiently reinforced.

In addition to fitting the camera into a ceiling directly using the camera mount bracket (accessory), the camera can be installed using the special brackets as follows.

#### S6131 S6111

- When hanging the camera from a ceiling, use the WV-Q105A ceiling mount bracket (option) or the WV-Q126A ceiling embedding bracket (option).
- When installing on a wall, use wall mount bracket WV-Q119 (option).

#### S6130

- When hanging the camera from a ceiling, use the WV-Q105A and WV-Q160C/ WV-Q160S ceiling mount bracket (option) or the WV-Q159C/WV-Q159S ceiling embedding bracket (option).
- When installing on a wall, use wall mount bracket WV-Q158C/WV-Q158S (option).

#### This camera is designed to be used indoors.

This product is not operable outdoors. Do not expose this camera to direct sunlight for hours and do not install the product near a heater or an air conditioner. Otherwise, it may cause deformation, discoloration and malfunction. Keep this camera away from water and moisture.

# Do not place this product in the following places:

- Locations where a chemical agent is used such as a swimming pool
- Locations subject to moisture or oil smoke such as a kitchen
- Locations that have a specific environment that is subject to an inflammable atmosphere or solvents
- Locations where a radiation, an X-ray, a strong radio wave or a strong magnetic field is generated
- Locations near coasts directly subjected to sea breezes, or locations subject to corrosive gases such as from hot springs, volcanic regions, etc.
- Locations where the temperature is not within the specified range (respage 30)
- Locations subject to vibrations, such as on vehicles, marine vessels, or above product lines (This product is not designed for onvehicle use.)
- Locations where it may get wet from rain or water splash (including under the eaves, etc.)

#### Mounting method for this product

This product is designed to be used as a pendant mount camera. If the product is mounted on a desktop or at a slant, it may not work correctly and its lifetime may be shortened.

#### Sulfurization caused by rubber products

Do not place the product near rubber products (packing, rubber feet, etc.) that contain sulfur. There is a risk that sulfur components in rubber products may cause electrical parts and terminals, etc. to become sulfurized and corrode.

#### Screw tightening

- The screws and bolts must be tightened with an appropriate tightening torque according to the material and strength of the installation area.
- Do not use an impact driver. Use of an impact driver may damage the screws or cause tightening excessively.
- When a screw is tightened, make the screw at a right angle to the surface. After tightening the screws or bolts, perform checks to ensure that the tightening is sufficient enough so that there is no movement or looseness.

#### Protective caps

The protective caps are used to prevent dirt and dust from entering inside this product. Keep the protective caps inserted in connectors that are not used.

#### **Protection from lightning**

When cables are used outdoors, there is a chance that they may be affected by lightning. In such a case, install a lightning arrestor close to the camera, and make the length of the network cable between the camera and lightning arrestor as short as possible to prevent the camera from being damaged by lightning.

#### When noise disturbance may happen

Conduct the power distribution work to keep a distance of 1 m {3.28 feet} or more from the 120 V (for U.S. and Canada) or 220 V – 240 V (for Europe and other countries) power line. Or conduct the electric conduit work separately (Always connect the metal pipe with grounding).

#### Radio disturbance

Noise may appear in video or audio near a strong electric field from a TV or radio antenna, motors and transformers, or a strong electric field/magnetic field from a power line (lamp line) of AC100 V or more.

#### PoE (Power over Ethernet)

Use a PoE hub/device that is compliant with IEEE802.3af standard.

#### Router

When connecting this product to the Internet, use a broadband router with the port forwarding function (NAT, IP masquerade).

Refer to the Operating Instructions on the provided CD-ROM for further information about the port forwarding function.








## **(Front view)**



- Do not use a tripod screw to mount the camera on the ceiling since the fall prevention measure is unavailable.

- ①Push "i" on the right of the i-PRO logo plate (refer to the illustration of 【Front view】 in Parts and functions) to unlock and pull it out.




② 12 V DC power supply terminal ③ Audio input connector

### ①Network connector (RJ45)

Connect an Ethernet cable (category 5e or better) to the network connector.

#### **IMPORTANT:**

- Use all 4 pairs (8 pins) of the Ethernet cable.
- The maximum length of the Ethernet cable (locally procured) is 100 m.
- Make sure that the PoE device in use is compliant with IEEE802.3af standard.
- When connecting both the 12 V DC power supply and the PoE device for power supply, 12 V DC will be used for power supply.
- When the Ethernet cable is disconnected once, reconnect the cable after around 2 seconds.
   When the cable is quickly reconnected, the power may not be supplied from the PoE device.

#### 212 V DC power supply terminal

#### Caution:

- A READILY ACCESSIBLE DISCONNECT DEVICE SHALL BE INCORPORATED TO THE EQUIPMENT POWERED BY 12 V DC POWER SUPPLY.
- ONLY CONNECT 12 V DC CLASS 2 POWER SUPPLY (UL 1310/CSA 223) or LIMITED POWER SOURCE (IEC/EN/UL/CSA 60950-1).

Connect the output cable of the DC power supply to the power cable plug (accessory).
